On Thursday, November 7, the Long Island Chapter of the IEEE Power Electronics Society (PELS) hosted its third annual <u>Power Electronics Symposium (PES)</u> at the Radisson Hotel in Hauppauge, NY. This year the symposium hosted over 52 exhibitors and noted many more on the waiting list. Exhibitors showcased a number of power products from including ac-dc power supplies, dc-dc converters, power semiconductors, passive components, magnetics, electro-mechanical devices, thermal management products, test equipment and compliance services.
